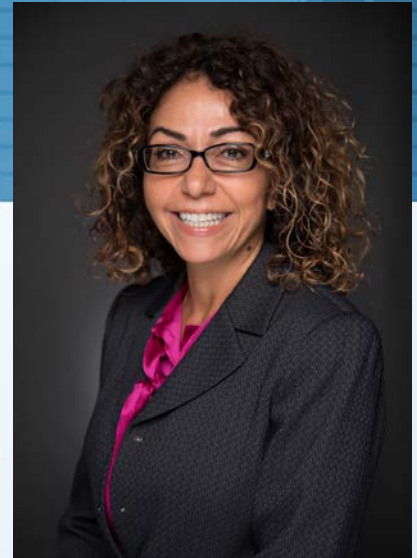


Nellie Navidi
